Local: The notorious petty criminal, known as the Dartmoor Shepherd, continued his 50 years' law-breaking - he was arrested in Matlock, Derbyshire, on a charge of sacrilege - his usual crime of stealing from an offertory box.

National: The school leaving age was raised to 14. 20,000 London policemen went on strike, demanding increased pay and union recognition.

International: British anti-Bolshevik troops occupied Archangel, Russia. On 10th August they were told to help White Russians against the newly established Communist (Red) regime.
