Local: Portuguese pit prop cutters, employed at Chudleigh Camp, were charged with maliciously wounding Matthews and James Cronan, Canadian Forestry Corps

National: The Representation of People Act entitled women over 30, who were occupiers of property or married to occupiers, to vote. Lord Clifford of Chudleigh opposed female suffrage, believing women to be guided by love and sympathy rather than by duty.

International: The British Government made a declaration to King of the Hejaz reaffirming their pledges as to freeing the Arab peoples.
