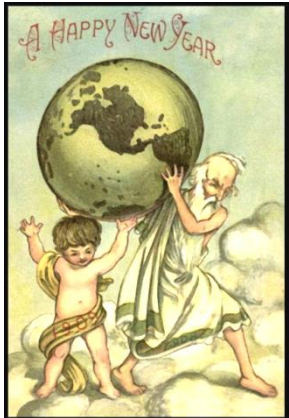

### THIS MONTH.....

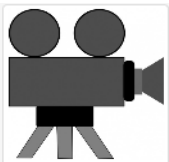
#### 100 YEARS AGO

**Local:** Two stained glass Memorial Windows were unveiled at Newton Abbot in memory of Lieut. A. E. Durham, R.N., lost at sea in March 1917, and his mother Mrs. Priscilla Durham who died in June 1917. His father, Rev W E Durham, Rector of Wolborough, became Trusham's Rector in 1919.

**National:** The government introduced compulsory rationing of sugar, butter, meat and beer. On 31<sup>st</sup> January, accidental collisions in misty Scottish waters led to the loss of 104 lives, 2 RN submarines and loss and damage to another 5 RN warships

**International:** US President Wilson issued his peace treaty proposals. T.E. Lawrence (of Arabia) continued to aid the Arab Revolt by commanding an attack on Turkish troops, defeating an entire battalion.
