100 YEARS AGO

Local: 25th November Trusham school reopened after 4 week's closure as a result of Spanish flu.

National: 9th November H.M.S. "Britannia" sunk by submarine in the Atlantic (last warship so lost).

International: 3rd November Mutiny in the German fleet at Kiel. Revolts spread. Kaiser Wilhelm abdicated **9th November**, fleeing to the Netherlands
11th November Armistice Signed in Marshal Foch's train. Western front Hostilities ceased at 11 a.m.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

This year, the two minutes' silence to remember those who died protecting our nation, coincides with the actual moment, when 100 years ago, guns on the Western Front fell silent, as the agreed armistice began. There will be a service of remembrance at our war memorial, on **Sunday 11th November**, beginning at **10:50am**, so that we can also fall silent, with many thousands, at 11am. Each of the names on the memorial will be recalled as an individual and a representative of all those who have died in service of our country. Ceramic poppies made by children and adults at the October workshop will be used in our act of remembrance, which we hope you will be able to attend.

Please do ask me if you would like some guidance about what could be put in your box, then label the outside with details of boy/girl and appropriate age, or grandmother/father or family. The boxes need to be with me no later than **Monday 12th November**, to be taken to the collection warehouse for the lorry taking them to Moldova - a local business person sponsors the transportation.

If you're able to fill a shoebox, or two, they would find a very good home with someone who may not receive any other gifts at Christmas - the joy the box would bring to them is immeasurable.
