The Lordship of the Manor of Trusham is included. Underlying the farm are large deposits of dibasic rock.

National: 3 February - Sinn Féin leader Éamon de Valera and two others escaped from Lincoln Prison International: 3 Feb, The first meeting of the League of Nations was held, its purpose to promote international security as well as world peace.

9th February 10am-1pm


