THIS MONTH.....

100 YEARS AGO

Local: Teign Valley Granite planned to lay off Trusham workers because it was unable to distribute stone as a result of railway truck shortages. Newton Rural Council asked the Transport Ministry to remove the cause, so preventing pauperism and increasing the supply of road metal.

National: February 23rd: War Secretary Winston Churchill announced that a volunteer army of 220,000 would allow conscription to end on March 31st. Men who had been drafted would be discharged by April 30th

International: February 24th: at the first mass meeting of the NSDAP, Hitler presented the 25 Point Programme - it included rejection of the Versailles Treaty; gaining more land, citizenship determined by race

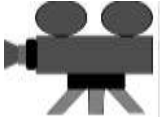

TEIGN VALLEY FILM NIGHT

This month's film is *'All Is True'* (2018 PG13 100 mins) The year is 1613, and Shakespeare is acknowledged as the greatest writer of the age. But disaster strikes when his renowned Globe Theatre burns to the ground. Devastated, Shakespeare returns to Stratford, where he must face a troubled past and a neglected family. Haunted by the death of his only son, Hamlet, he struggles to mend the broken relationship with his wife and daughters. In so doing, he is ruthlessly forced to examine his own failings as a husband and father. Starring Kenneth Branagh as the Bard, (and director, Judi Dench and Ian McKellen offer solid support in a story of Shakespeare's home life that tiptoes between fact and fiction. Impressively cast and beautifully filmed, *All is True* takes an elegiac look at Shakespeare's final days.

AND

OLD TRUSHAM

Just inside the church is the Norman font, made of Salcombe stone (also used building Exeter Cathedral). It was replaced in c1800s by Rev.



Gregory, who removed or covered many of the attributes of the ancient church in his programme of modernisation (Victorianising? vandalising?) The stone font was rescued from the churchyard by the Revd. Carey in 1912. He wrote that it '*was condemned to an ignominious existence under the churchyard yew tree*'

On the village website are the Trusham baptismal records from 1599 to 1914, with most of the ceremonies carried out at this old font, as have baptisms from 1912 to the present day.

Those baptised here in the 21st century are adding their names to the long line

Rev Thomas Hawker, Trusham's curate from 1821 until his death in 1848 had at least eighteen children. Eight, all baptised in Plymouth, were with his first wife, Sarah Ann Vincent who died in 1819 in Plymouth. Four of the eight died and were buried in Trusham. The other ten were with his second wife Agnes Watson. They were all baptised at the Norman font. Six of them - Charles, Agnes, Emma, Emily, Stafford and Agnes were buried in Trusham, as was their father.
